THE SEMINAR

This clinical seminar will focus on the Children First guidelines and their implications for psychotherapists, psychologists and other professionals working in clinical settings with clients.

SPEAKER

Ellen O'Malley-Dunlop was appointed CEO of the Dublin Rape Crisis Centre in May 2006. She is a member of the Irish Forum for Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy (IFPP). She has a special interest in establishing a place of privilege for counselling and psychotherapy notes in the Criminal Justice System. She is a psychotherapist and group analyst by profession and is a former Chairperson of the Irish Council for Psychotherapy

(ICP). She was a founder member and Director of the Irish Institute of Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy (IFPP) and for fifteen years worked on the MSc in Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy clinical training programme at Trinity College Dublin. She was a member of the Board of the National Women's Council of Ireland. She is a feminist with an interest in Irish mythology and its relevance to contemporary society and runs the Bard Annual Summer School on Clare Island County Mayo. She is a former Chieftain of the O'Malley Clan.

CHAIR

Julie Brown is a psychoanalytic psychotherapist and member of the Executive Committee of the Irish Forum for Psychoanalytic Psychotherapy (IFPP). She has worked in the area of sexual violence for eleven years. Julie currently works in the Advocacy Department of One in Four where she offers information and support to clients in respect of child protection and the criminal and civil justice systems specifically with regard to sexual violence. Julie has conducted research into complainants' experiences of the criminal justice system and is trained in the use of restorative justice conferencing for complex cases.
